Annual meeting held Jan. 23

Elected as delegates to the Diocesan Convention were Jerry Jacobson, Sandi Orbell and Helen Reed, with Chet Kasmarski and Bruce Sedgwick elected to serve as alternates.

Following discussion, the budget for 2011 was adopted as presented, and a round of applause went to Betsy Smith, who 'retired' as COR treasurer. Ty Zeller is taking over as new treasurer. Staff, committee and reports on 2010 budget activity are available, as are reports on pledges and the budget for 2011.


