When I was a young girl, I remember asking my aunt how she had enough time and energy to raise her three children. It seemed an overwhelming burden to me. Her answer offered an epiphany I've never forgotten: "You think your life is full, and then you just find that you have enough love and time for more."

This is the loaves and fishes story in action. We see only scarcity until someone or some event pushes us to recognize the abundance that we have to share.

This year's Stewardship Campaign "Lattes, Loaves and Fishes" is a call to one of those moments. We have an abundance at Church of the Resurrection. We have an abundance of talent, intellect, generosity, beauty and commitment. We share that abundance with one another every week in liturgy, prayer and song. And we began this new season with a celebration of the many ministries that have grown thanks to the talents and commitment of our congregation.

The table is set for us every week – we serve and are served. But for the table to fully nourish all aspects of our church – the building and grounds, the staff, the education, music, and ritual of our services, the pastoral care and outreach to the community– we need to devote ourselves as well to our church's financial health.

We ask the congregation to consider our Church life as an invitation to the table, and to help us fill the table with all we need to sustain our work. It will not be enough if we simply continue to give what we have given in previous years. We are asking everyone to increase your weekly gift by the value of one menu item. We are not asking you to give up your lattes, loaves and fishes. We are asking you to share them so that all aspects of our church life can be nourished in 2011.

Our Stewardship letters were mailed on October 20th. If you did not receive one, please pick up one of the extra letters and pledge cards available at church every Sunday. We are hoping to have pledges submitted by November 7th. You may all expect a call from another member of the congregation as an invitation to share in setting the table for the whole community. If you have already pledged, the call will be a grateful one!

Music Education

Caedmon’s Hymn

by Caedmon (c. 657-681)

Cædmon was an Anglo Saxon herdsman attached to the double monastery of Streonæshalch (657–681). Originally ignorant of the art of song, Cædmon learned to compose one night in the course of a dream. Cædmon’s only known surviving work is Cædmon’s Hymn, the nine line alliterative vernacular praise poem in honor of the Christian God he supposedly learned to sing in his initial dream. The poem is one of the earliest attested examples of Old English and is one of three candidates for the earliest attested example of Old English poetry. It is also one of the earliest recorded examples of sustained poetry in a Germanic language.

Here's a translation into Modern English (courtesy of Wikipedia):

Now [we] must honour the guardian of heaven, the might of the architect,
and his purpose, the work of the father of glory as he, the eternal lord,
established the beginning of wonders.

He, the holy creator, first created heaven as a roof for the children of men.
Then the guardian of mankind, the eternal lord, the lord almighty,
afterwards appointed the middle earth, the lands, for men.

Make a joyful noise unto the Lord!


