## A Letter from Rabbi Maurice Harris

Shalom from your neighbors at Temple Beth Israel. When I learned that one of the suggestions offered to your congregation for Lent was for people to come visit us at Temple Beth Israel for a Friday night Shabbat service, I felt touched. Our services are open to all, and we warmly welcome you to come join us. Friday night services begin at 7:30 (though they may get started a few minutes late), and usually end around 9 PM. They're informal and include a lot of singing in Hebrew. Our prayer books have English translations and transliterations, in order to help people who can't read Hebrew join in. Unfortunately, we don't have childcare provided, though we do have a "family room" adjacent to our main sanctuary with a large window facing the sanctuary and the sanctuary sound piped in through speakers, in case you have little ones who get extra wiggly during the service. You don't need to get all dressed up, and it's okay to leave early if you need to. We're a non-proselytizing religious community, and we fully respect affirm the validity of other religions, and we very much appreciate opportunities to strengthen ties with our neighbors of other faith traditions. At the end of our services we always ask people who are visiting for the first time to introduce themselves. Immediately following services we celebrate what is called an "oneg," which includes ritual blessings over wine/grape juice and challah bread, snacks and schmoozing. I hope to get to meet some of you in the weeks ahead!

# Search Committee Moves into Full Swing

The Search Committee has been appointed by the Vestry. The members are Dave Beuerman and Dick Zeller (Co-Chairs), Ellen Cabeza, Kathleen O’Gieblyn, Tim Rake and Lucy Strandlien.

The Co-Chairs and Senior Warden Jerry Jacobson met with The Rev. Canon Neysa Ellgren, Canon for Congregational Development and our contact at the Bishop’s Close. The meeting provided us an excellent starting point with the Diocese and valuable guidance to “a flexible process that will work for Resurrection.”

Our tentative timeline has the Committee producing a “Profile” of the Church of the Resurrection for submission to the Bishop by May 1. Members of the Church will have opportunities to provide input to the profile regarding both our “joys and sorrows” for Resurrection and what we consider most important in our search for a new spiritual leader. An online survey (paper and pencil for those who prefer) will be available in early April for written comments and expressions of preference for aspects of the ministries and programs of Resurrection. We will also make time for at least two interactive sessions with those interested.

Within a month from the time the Bishop receives and approves our profile, he will send us names of interested candidates. The Search Committee will perform the usual due diligence of checking references, arranging phone interviews, possible visits to the candidates’ current churches, etc. For finalists, the Search Committee and the Vestry will be involved in visits with the candidates, formal and informal interviews, and worship. We hope to complete the process in time to call our new “Priest in Charge” by September 1. Keep the Committee, the candidates and the timeline in your prayers. If you have a candidate who you hope will be included in the search, let that person know about the opening at Resurrection and encourage them to contact the Bishop to express their interest. Please keep the Search Committee in your prayers. Feel free to ask any of the Committee members about the process or to offer your input.

## Central Convocation Mission and Ministry Fair set for April 2

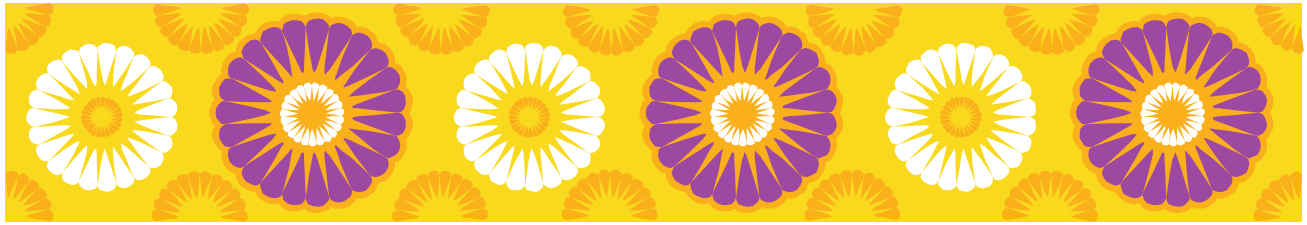

- ✓ **2 to 2:45 PM** Powers of Attorney-Wills-Trust-Probate will be offered by Jane Stewart, Attorney at Law.

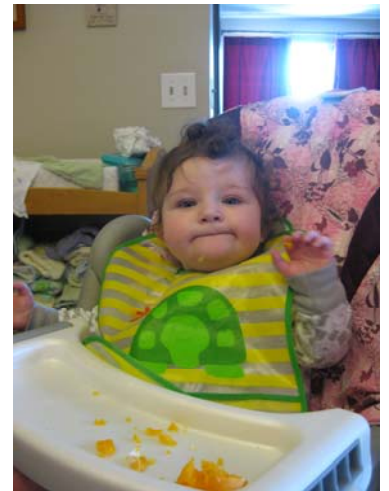

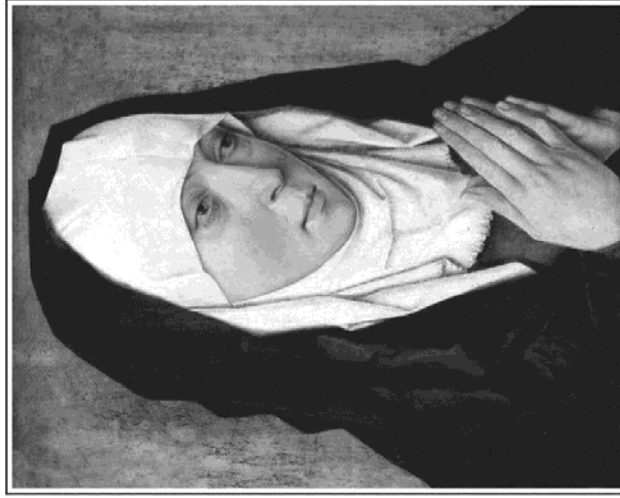
