

FIRST LESSON: JEREMIAH 11:18-20 (NRSV)

*Reader* A Reading from the Prophet Jeremiah.

*J*t was the Lord who made it known to me, and I knew;

then you showed me their evil deeds.  
But I was like a gentle lamb  
led to the slaughter.  
And I did not know it was against me  
that they devised schemes, saying,  
"Let us destroy the tree with its fruit,  
let us cut him off from the land of the living,  
so that his name will no longer be remembered!"  
But you, O Lord of hosts, who judge righteously,  
who try the heart and the mind,  
let me see your retribution upon them,  
for to you I have committed my cause.

*Reader* Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.  
*People* **Thanks be to God.**

## PSALM 54

*Deus, in nomine*

- S**ave me, O God, by your Name; \*  
in your might, defend my cause.
- 2 Hear my prayer, O God; \*  
give ear to the words of my mouth.
- 3 For the arrogant have risen up against me,  
and the ruthless have sought my life, \*  
those who have no regard for God.
- 4 Behold, God is my helper; \*  
it is the Lord who sustains my life.
- 5 Render evil to those who spy on me; \*

## SECOND LESSON: JAMES 3:13-4:3, 7-8A (NRSV)

*Reader* A Reading from the Letter of James.

**W**ho is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace.

Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts. You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures.

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will

draw near to you.

*Reader* Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

*People* **Thanks be to God.**

#### THE GOSPEL: MARK 9:30-37 (NRSV)

*People* The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ, according to Mark.  
**Glory to you, O Christ.**

*J*esus and his disciples passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again." But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him.

Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." Then he took a little child and put it among them; and taking it in his arms, he said to them, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me."

#### THE NICENE CREED

**We believe in one God,  
the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is, seen and unseen.  
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father,  
who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified,  
who has spoken through the prophets.**

**We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

## THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

*Deacon* Christ calls us to a life of peace and humility. Let us pray for strength to live this baptized life, saying: Lord, have mercy.

For all the baptized people of God, that having been called by our Lord we may gladly wait on those in need, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

For all in authority in nation and church, that they may learn humility, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

For all countries at war, that the peace of Christ may come among them, and for all who suffer the ravages of wartime, that they may find comfort and refuge, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

For all who minister in this and in every Christian community, that they may find strength for their tasks, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

For all children, that they may be welcomed, fed, housed, and loved and may grow with self-confidence and joy, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

For all in any need, the sick, the suffering, the oppressed; and for those who serve others against their own will, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

For what else shall we pray or give thanks?

*The people may offer their own intercessions and thanksgivings.*

Let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

For all the saints who have willingly served others, we praise our Servant God. That we may join them in a life of service, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**

*Celebrant* Receive us, O God, as you received the child in Capernaum, for we yearn for your mercy, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

## CONFESSION OF SIN

*The Deacon or Celebrant says*

Let us confess our sins to God.

*Silence may be kept.*

*Minister and People*

**God of all mercy,**

**we confess that we have sinned against you,  
opposing your will in our lives.**

**We have denied your goodness in each other,  
in ourselves, and in the world you have created.**

**We repent of the evil that enslaves us,**



Living among us, Jesus loved us. He broke bread with outcasts and sinners, healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor. He yearned to draw all the world to himself yet we were heedless of his call to walk in love. Then, the time came for him to complete upon the cross the sacrifice of his life, and to be glorified by you.

On the night before he died for us, Jesus was at table with his friends. He took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to them, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine. Again, he gave thanks to you, gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Now gathered at your table, O God of all creation, and remembering Christ, crucified and risen, who was and is and is to come, we offer to you our gifts of bread and wine, and ourselves, a living sacrifice.

Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ. Breathe your Spirit over the whole earth and make us your new creation, the Body of Christ given for the world you have made.

In the fullness of time bring us, with the ever blessed Virgin Mary and all your saints, from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, **to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. AMEN.**

#### BREAKING OF THE BREAD

*The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread.*

*A period of silence is kept.*

*Then may be sung or said.*

*Celebrant* Alleluia. We break this bread to share in the Body of Christ.

*People* **We who are many are one body, for we all share in the one bread. Alleluia.**

*Facing the people, the Celebrant says the following Invitation*

*Celebrant* The Gifts of God for the People of God.

*The ministers receive the Sacrament in one kind, and then immediately deliver it to the people.*

*The Bread is given to the communicants with these words*

*Celebrant* The Body and Blood of Jesus Christ keep you in everlasting life.

## POSTCOMMUNION PRAYER

*After Communion, the Celebrant says*

Let us pray.

*Silence.*

*Celebrant and People*

**God of abundance,  
you have fed us  
with the bread of life and cup of salvation;  
you have united us  
with Christ and one another;  
and you have made us one  
with all your people in heaven and on earth.  
Now send us forth  
in the power of your Spirit,

and continue for ever  
in the risen life of Christ our Savior. Amen.**
